### Elizabeth & Forest Fyfe Award

The Elizabeth & Forest Fyfe Award is offered annually through a trust fund initiated by the late Elizabeth M. Fyfe, of Halifax, Nova Scotia, and managed by the Abilities Foundation of Nova Scotia.

#### AWARD CRITERIA

1. The award is available to all residents of Nova Scotia, up to age 21, who function with a physical disability.
2. Those persons with a mobility disability will be given preference.
3. The award will be presented to a student enrolled in a Nova Scotia educational or training institution.
4. The award may be used to cover costs associated with the applicant's musical development, including, but not restricted to, tuition.
5. No individual shall receive the award in consecutive years unless determined by the selection committee.
